Thank you for providing comment. The site is zoned Rural Lands and Agriculture, not Timberland Preserve. Is this land considered private timberland by CAL FIRE standards regardless of zoning designation and therefore a Timberland Conversion is required? Is there a minimum number of trees to be removed that would trigger this permit from CAL FIRE? The applicant proposes tree removal within the Oak Mitigation Plan area, and plans to disturb approximately 1.8 acres, as identified by the polygon with the yellow star area below.

Hello Chief Sone,

I am following up on a referral from Paul Duncan for a project that is currently under appeal. Available for download are the project documents. Please see below for an excerpt from the 6/11/26 Planning Commission hearing staff report pertaining to tree removal.

Oak Tree Mitigation Plan

The applicant proposes to develop approximately 1.8 acres of their property for the construction of a cannabis nursery building and processing facility. Preparing the proposed site for development will require the conversion of an established oak woodland. The project site was evaluated and surveyed by Jacobszoon and Associates on September 11, 2024. A census survey of the site produced a total of three hundred sixty-two (362) black oaks and six (6) ponderosa pines. It is anticipated that all 362 oaks will be removed during the conversion operation to prepare the site for development of the appurtenant facilities.

The Oak Woodlands Protection Act and the County of Lake identify mitigation standards for projects that convert oak woodland to another use. Under the Oak Woodlands Protection Act, Lake County shall

require one or more oak woodland alternatives "to mitigate the significant effect of the conversion of oak woodlands." Alternatives to mitigate the significant effect of the conversion of oak woodlands include replacing removed trees at a rate of 3:1 and maintaining these trees pursuant to Section 4526 of Senate Bill No. 1334, terminating seven years after the trees are planted.

To comply with the California Oak Woodlands Conservation Act, oaks removed from the site will be replaced at a 3:1 ratio. Suitable planting sites exist surrounding the conversion area primarily to the south and west. One thousand eighty-six (1,086) black oaks will be planted, protected and irrigated for seven years to mitigate tree removal within the woodland. The removal of this amount of trees requires a Complex Grading Permit to be obtained, and all grading and earthwork would be in compliance with Chapter 30, Grading Ordinance, of the Lake County Municipal Code.

This letter is regarding the request for agency review for a commercial cannabis expansion project near Kelseyville, CA (PL-25-71) located at 10750 Siegler Springs Road. I have reviewed the documents you sent me via email on June 16, 2026. In reviewing Appendix C (Plant and Wildlife Species observed in the study area) and Appendix D (Biological Resources Assessment), it has been documented that conifer and hardwood species exist within the project area, specifically: incense cedar, knobcone pine, ponderosa pine, Douglas-fir, and black oak.

There are four conditions that require a permit from CAL FIRE resource management. On private timberland when a landowner sells, barter, trades, or converts timberland to a non-timberland use, a permit from CAL FIRE is required. As such, the land must be considered "timberland" pursuant to the Public Resources Code (PRC). PRC 4526 states: "timberland means land, other than land owned by the federal government and land designated by the board as experimental forest land, which is available for, and capable of, growing a crop of trees of any commercial species used to produce lumber and other forest products, including Christmas trees."

"Commercial Species" pursuant to 14CCR 895.1 "means those species found in group A and those in group B that are found on lands where the species in group A are now growing naturally or have grown naturally in the recorded past."

For the district of Lake County where the project is proposed, commercial species exist within the project area. These species are identified below:

Group A:

Ponderosa pine, Douglas-fir, incense cedar

Group B:

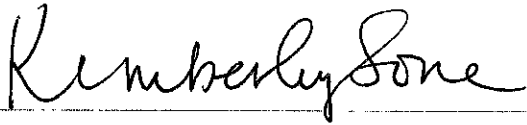
Knobcone pine, California Black Oak

Therefore, timberland may be present in the project area. According to Appendix D, montane hardwood-conifer forest is present within 9.72 acres of the project area (those areas identified as Area H, portions of A, C, E, F, G, and within buffers surrounding all other areas). If timberland is within the project area and is proposed for conversion

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(timberland converted to a non-timberland use), then a timber harvesting plan is required to be accepted or approved prior to the start of timber operations. Please feel free to contact me with any questions.
