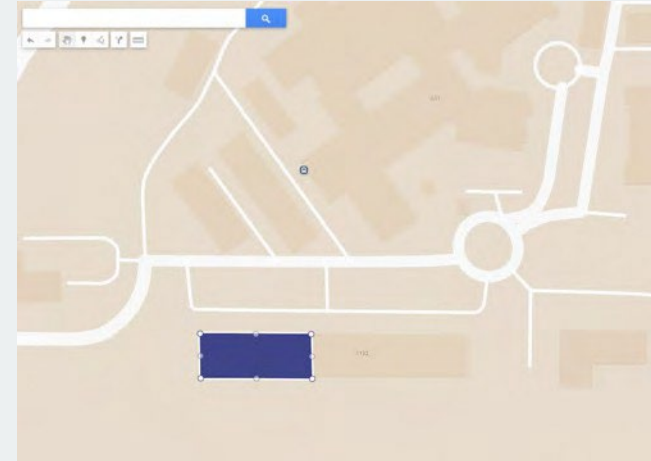

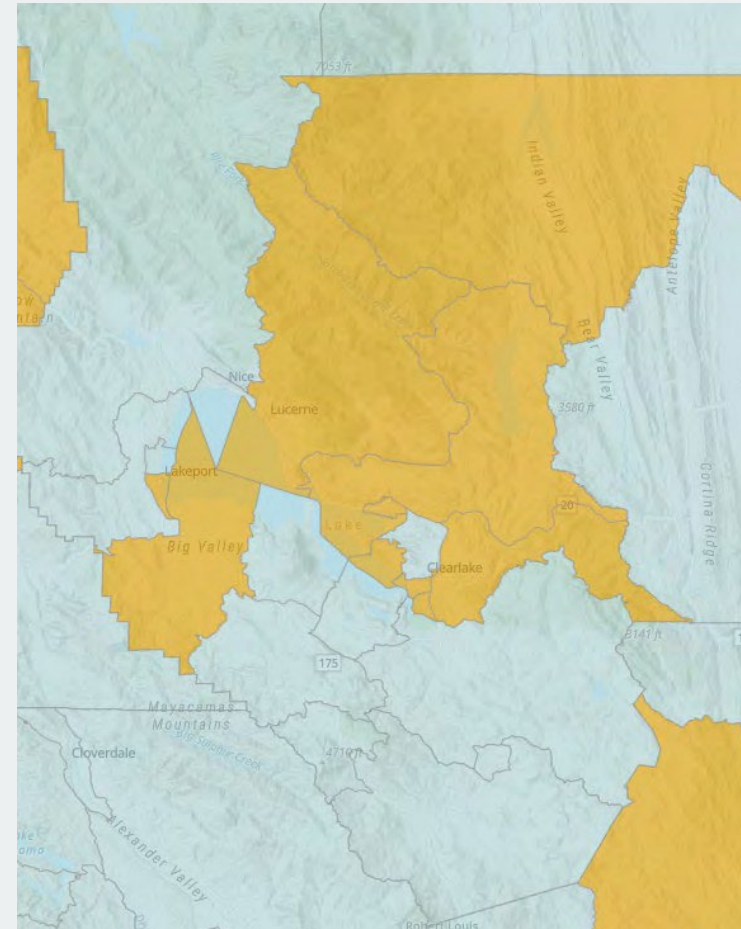

H.R. 1 – Reconciliation Bill

Opportunity Zones

- Now permanent – decennial designation
- Step-up-in basis 3x advantage for rural OZs
30% versus 10%
- Cutting the “substantial improvement” requirement in half for investments in rural areas
- Governor Office decides next designations and taking effect in 2027



CEQA Exemptions from State Budget

There are Requirements to Qualify for CEQA Exemption. Vary by Project Type

AB 130

CEQA Exemption for Certain Housing Developments

Incorporated Areas or Census Urban Areas

Excludes Parcels in Very High Fire Hazard Severity Zones

SB 131

CEQA Exemption for Certain Types of Development Projects

Health Centers and Rural Clinics

Childcare Centers

Advanced Manufacturing Facilities

Food Banks

Farm Worker Housing

Clean Water Projects

Wildfire Risk Mitigation Projects

Broadband
