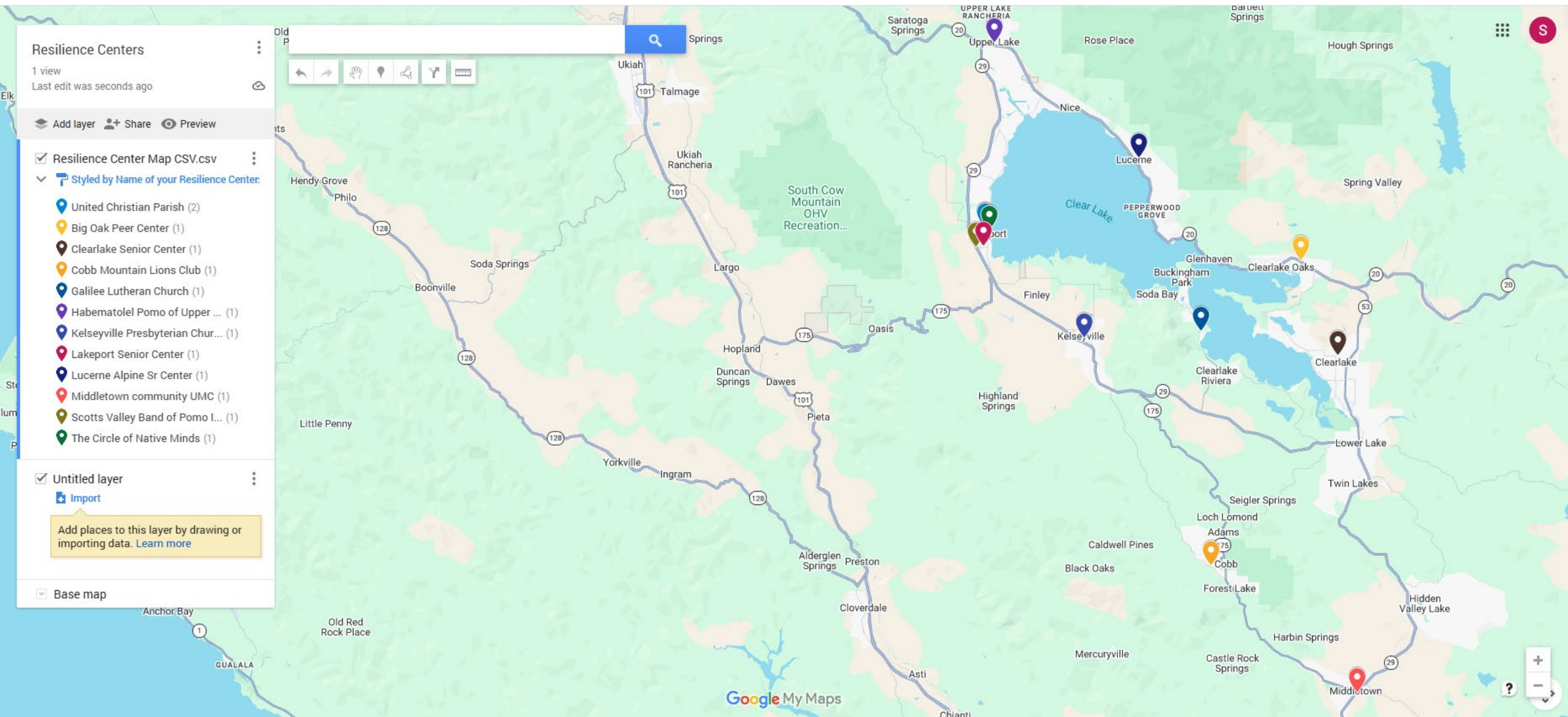


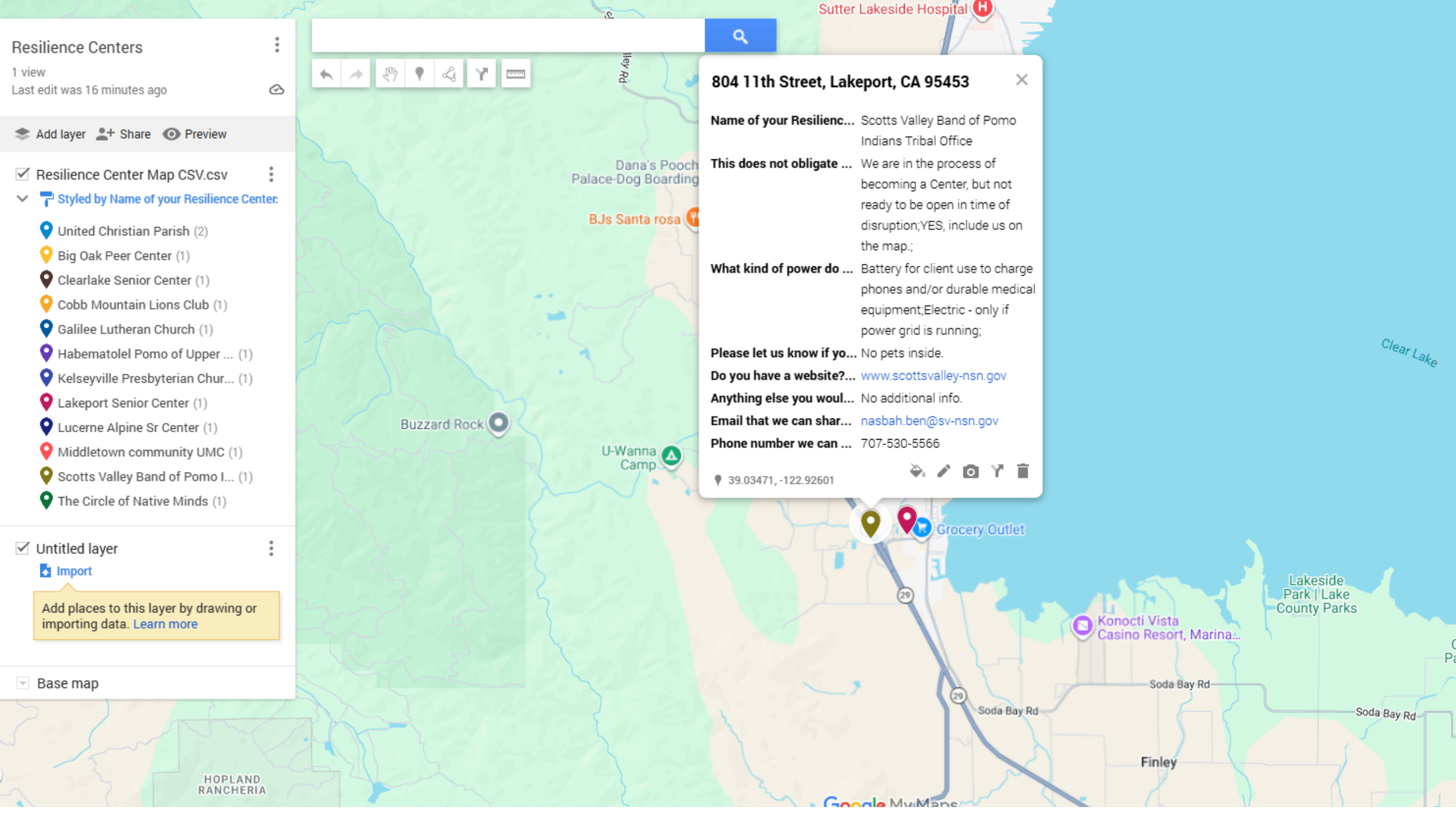
Purpose: Strengthen community preparedness and resilience through local Resilience Centers.

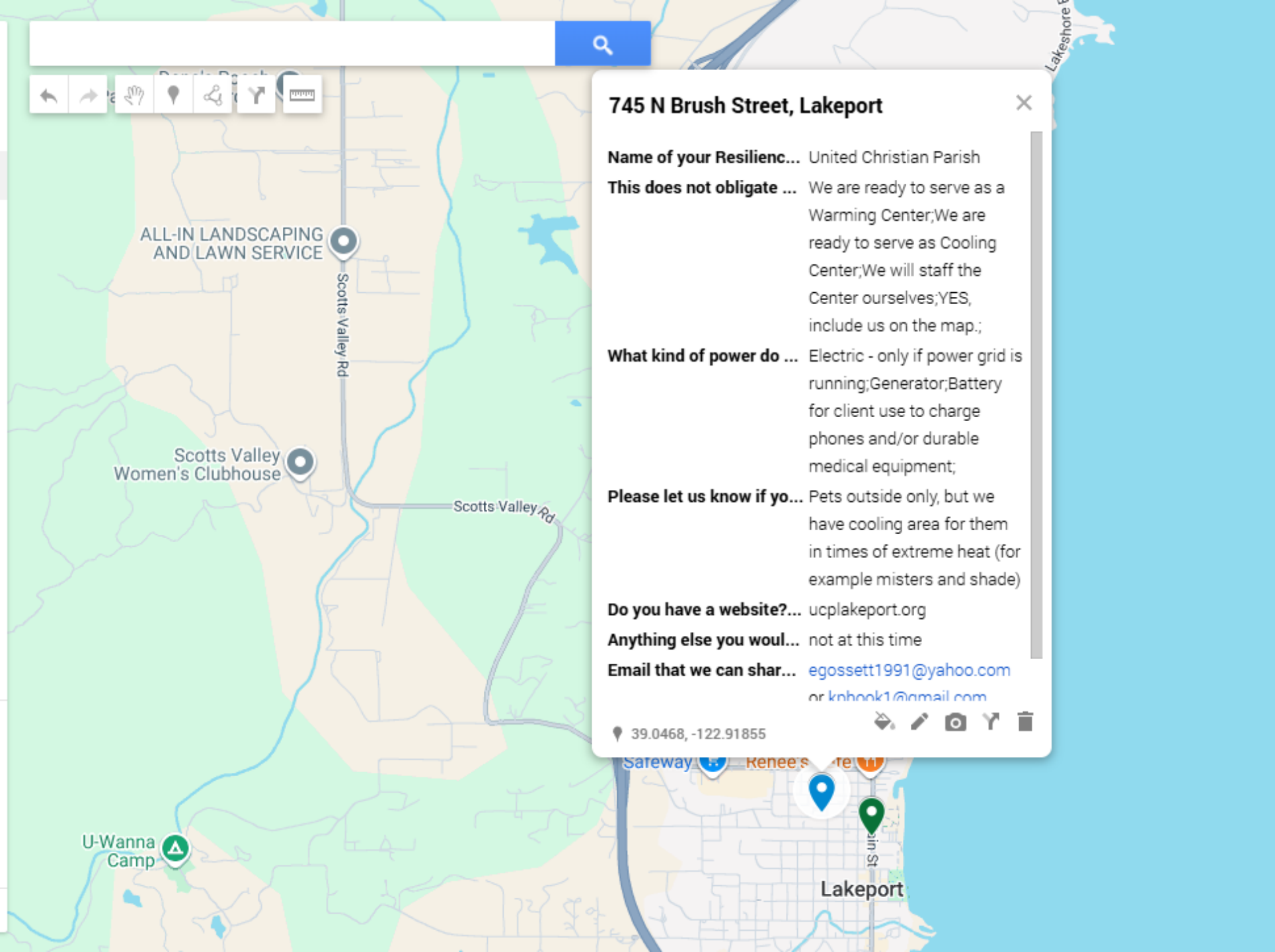

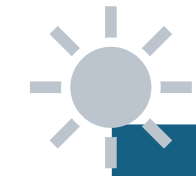

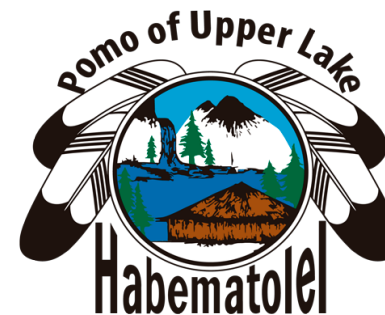
